

YOUTH CENTER OF EPIRUS

The Youth Center of Epirus (YC Epirus) is a non-profit organisation located in loannina, in the heart of the Epirus region, Greece. It hosts departments of young adult non-formal education and asylum seeker integration. The organisation is internationally certified for Support Services for the Improvement of Citizen's Lives and the Upgrading of General Living Conditions, by the International Organization for Standradization and has received Certification as a provider of Primary Social Care services of a non-profit nature from the Ministry of Labor and Social Affairs.

The young adult center in Kaplani 10, loannina is open to public during every study year. The center is an an open space for all young adults who look for non-formal education, local and international opportunities. YC Epirus offers activities related to volunteerism, non-formal education, social inclusion and cultural awareness. Our international team is combined of volunteers and youth workers who offer various workshops, informative and cultural events for youth and young adults.

YC Epirus organizes and participates also in international educational projects such as youth exchanges, training courses, seminars, as well as voluntarism, research and capacity building projects under the Erasmus+, CERV, European Solidarity Corps and programmes. In addition, the place Europe Direct Information hosts Center where regional society can receive information related to EU opportunities, grants, citizen rights, etc.

YC Epirus asylum seeker integration department operates a local project that provides accommodation, integration, health care, educational and other support to young asylum seekers in Epirus region.


IOANNINA

Set on the western shore of the lovely Lake Pamvotis, loannina is one of northern Greece's most atmospheric cities, and one of its more cultured and wealthy, as it was famous throughout the Ottoman Empire for its silver artisans. The walls of its old fortified city, the Kastro, enclose a tranquil quarter, spiked with minarets, and an island in the lake is a quiet, car-free escape. At sunset the lake turns silver and the impressive mountains behind turn lilac. Ioannina is a beautiful place in every season.

The strong cultural traditions of the town, home to a number of great novelists and poets, and the artistic and intellectual events which are organized throughout the year, give visitors the opportunity to get to know the roots of the intellectual life of Epirus.

Ioannina was always multicultural, dominated mainly by Christian, Islamic and Jewish influences. This coexistence of cultural influences is clearly evident in the historic city centre.

- No criminal record.




ACTIVITY

Within this activity, we continue our approach to integrating international voluntarism in the local young adult activity sector of our organisation.

Volunteers would help to run the youth center, offer weekly activities to young adults, plan and manage small-scale events, assist with the work on largeevents, if planned by the scale organisation, and work on online content creation on social or cultural heritage themes, addressed to local young adults (video making, photography, podcast, etc). They would be working individually possibly in teams, in daily and cooperation with a youth activity coordinator. Depending on daily needs, they would be helping with other various tasks at the youth office.











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We expect that participants will discover or develop their passions and skills because of the exposure to youth work, non formal education, cultural awareness and social issues. During the various types of tasks, participants will learn how to work with young adults and how to reflect on and address youth social issues. We expect that participants will experience a rise of their social awareness and responsibility, increase their digital skills, and gain a higher appreciation and experience in using non-formal education with young adults, apart from other activity-related skills.



ACTIVITY II

The volunteers will support the Youth and Asylum Seeker departments of our organisation.


Participants will volunteer at the accommodation facility for unaccompanied male asylum seekers aged 12 to 17. The facility is coordinated by our organisation since 2020 and is located in Perama village near loannina. The volunteers will work in a team with other volunteers to plan, prepare, implement, and report non-formal educational and recreational activities for the asylum seekers at the facility, for a few hours every day.

Moreover, they will be working at our office daily and get engaged in individual or pair research and digital content production about topics relevant to asylum seekers, therefore being actively involved in civic life and promoting awareness about the humanitarian crisis which affects the whole of Europe and not only.





We expect that participants will discover new interests and views due to exposure to social issues, humanitarian and social work. Through all types of activities which will occur during the project, participants will learn the ways to work with children and youth, with not well defended part of society and in general to access the situation and needs of community. The project aims to help the participants to grow as social personalities, to rise their level of social responsibility, improve their understanding of dangers of marginalization of asylum seekers and worldwide political and migration processes. It is important to note that this activity can be emotionally demanding due to the conditions - activities will have to be adapted to a large language gap and the circumstances of the daily life and rules at the facility - a lot of flexibility will be required.



APPLICATION AND SELECTION PROCESS

Applicants must clearly indicate to which of the two activities they apply. Staff members of our Youth department will contact you within a few days if we have an open vacancy and if your profile matches to the volunteer we are looking for!

It is important to read this document carefully and confidently choose and apply to one of the activities - to the one that suits the best to your skills and interests.

Afterwards, the applicant will enter into a selection process in which they will have 2 online interviews and, of course, learn more details about the activities.
